- ▼ T.Q.A.A. (Trades Qualification Apprenticeship Act) regulated trade
 - You must be 16 years old with a minimum of Grade 10 (Grade 8 for Brick & Stone Mason, Cement Mason, Drywall Finisher & Plasterer)
- ▲ A.C.A. (Apprenticeship Certification Act) regulated trade
 - You must be a minimum of 16 years old with Grade 12 (Grade 10 for Assistant Cook Br.1 and Autobody Repairer Br. 2)

- A Certificate of Qualification is available for this trade
- Interprovincial Standard (Red Seal) trade: A Red Seal confirms a nationally recognized level of competency in the trade; the journey person is licensed to practice the trade across Canada
- R Restricted Trade: only registered apprentices or certified journeymen may practice the skill set for this trade
 - OYAP students are exempt during work hours specified in their Work Education Agreements for T.Q.A.A. Compulsory trades
 - OYAP students may not perform restricted skill sets for A.C.A. trades unless they become registered apprentices
