## The Ontario Technological Skills Competition Pin Design Contest

### ELIGIBILITY:

Students from affiliated high schools and colleges are eligible to participate. An affiliation form is available from Skills Canada – Ontario upon request, or on our website at [www.skillsontario.com](http://www.skillsontario.com).

### SPECIFICATIONS:

- The design may be a maximum of 3 colours. Black and white are considered colours, if you choose to use them. The bronze pin material is not considered a colour and is best used as the outline of your design.
- Designs may be created by hand or on computer. Designs must be submitted in full colour on 8½" x 11" paper. The design must be such that it can easily be reduced to a 1" x 1" maximum size pin.
- Designs must meet the following criteria:
  - Recognize the year of the competition (2010) and/or indicate the 21<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the OTSC
  - Include the acronym "OTSC".
- **All entries must be identified with the student's name, school, teacher/advisor, course, grade, complete home mailing address and home phone number.**
- All submissions become the property of Skills Canada - Ontario and will not be returned. Skills Canada - Ontario has the right to reproduce the design, or modify it in any media chosen.
- **Please note:** Skills Canada – Ontario is a not-for-profit organization and not a government office. Although trillium and maple-leaf designs may be used, they are not suggested or required.
- Selected submissions may be displayed during the dates of the competition: May 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>, 2010 at the RIM Park and Manulife Financial Sportsplex, Waterloo.
- This is an individual event. No teams please!
- The winning design may be produced as the official medal awarded to competitors at the 2010 Ontario Technological Skills Competition.
