## Personal Support Worker Program Eligibility and Next Steps





## **Key Points for Success:**

- ✓ Genuine desire to care for others and make a difference!
- ✓ Strong work ethic and good interpersonal skills
- ✓ Positive attitude
- ✓ Attendance: there are mandatory hours for the PSW certificate

### **Eligibility Requirements:**

- √ 18 years of age or older
- ✓ Reliable transportation to school and placements
- ✓ Reliable daycare
- ✓ Up-to-date immunizations, including against COVID-19 and a clear 2-step TB test
- ✓ Clear Police Vulnerable Sector Check for Employment
- X You do not need an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). You will have the opportunity to work towards your diploma during the PSW program!

### **Program Details: 2 Options**

### 6-month Accelerated, Hybrid Option

- 2 weeknights plus every other weekend for placement in addition to self-guided study
- Combination of synchronous, asynchronous, in-class, and placements
- Class time is 5pm-10pm 2 weeknights
- Placements are 8-hour days every other weekend & some weekdays; clinicals are 6am-2pm
- Pick from:
  - → July December in St. Catharines (Lifetime Learning Centre)
  - → January June in St. Catharines (Lifetime Learning Centre)

#### 10-month Day Program Option

- Monday-Friday in-class learning no evenings or weekends!
- Class time is 9am-12:45pm
- Placements are full days on weekdays; clinical placements are 2 days a week from 6am-2pm
- Pick from:
  - → September June in St. Catharines (Lifetime Learning Centre)
  - → September June in Niagara Falls (Gate Alliance Church)
  - → February January with no summer classes in St. Catharines (Lifetime Learning Centre)

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#### Placements for both options:

- Placements in a variety of settings, such as long-term care, homecare, retirement living, adult day programs, schools, and more
- Clinical placements are 6am-2pm 2 days a week
- Community and Consolidated placements are each 3 weeks of full-time hours; variable shifts
- ❖ Tuition is currently paid for by the provincial government for the 2022-2023 school year. There may be fees for the 2023-2024 school year

## **Next Steps:**

- ✓ Sign up for an interview includes a meeting with Transition to Employment
  - → Please bring:
    - Completed PSW Application Form
    - 1 letter of reference and a resume, if possible (optional)
    - 2 pieces of government identification
    - Social Insurance Number (for Transition to Employment)
    - Proof of Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or proof of completing grade
      12 English
- ✓ If you do not have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or grade 12 English, you will complete a literacy test following your interview
- ❖ If you are successful, you will receive a Conditional Offer of Acceptance followed by next steps for a police check and medical paperwork to be completed by your orientation


## If accepted and you are not born in Canada:

- ✓ You need English language ability equal to Canadian Language Benchmark Level 6
