Indigenous Education at the DSBN is working towards:

- Further supporting the wellness (well-being and school experiences) of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students to promote student achievement and increase student voice.
- Strengthening the presence of Indigenous culture, languages, and history for all students.
- Assisting educators to incorporate Indigenous knowledge into their teaching practices.
- Working with the Indigenous Education Advisory Council (IEAC) to increase the involvement of community partners in the work we are doing.
- Improving our relationships with parents, through parent engagement sessions starting in the fall of 2023.

Indigenous Student Trustee

- Nodin Buck – Governor Simcoe - represents the voice of Indigenous and all students in decisions about education in Niagara, and he supports in keeping students informed about important decisions that affect them
- Nodin will work with the Indigenous Student Leadership Circle (ISLC) a monthly circle to connect First Nations, Métis, and Inuit secondary students from across the board with the support of the Indigenous Education team.
