#### 1. Welcome

Marianne Groat, Student Achievement Leader for Indigenous Education, welcomed and thanked everyone for participating in the meeting.

## 3. Introductions

An Anishinabek Nation calendar and the Ted Nolan book "Life in Two Worlds" were presented to attendees.

Kirsty Howie led the group in a sharing circle, to allow attendees to meet and know each other better.

## 4. Indigenous Student Trustee Update - Clayton Mishibinijima & Dale McKay

Clayton and Dale spoke about their recent trip to Camp Olympia with the Indigenous Student Leadership group. They shared feedback from these students about what they felt was going well in schools such as regular use of the Land Acknowledgement, FNMI clubs, and staff support for creating community among Indigenous students. They also shared some places where improvements could be made, including supporting staff to pronounce Indigenous words properly.

## 5. Feedback Summary

At the last in-person meeting, participants were asked to provide feedback on a variety of topics including visual representation, opportunities for students in community, and future meeting structure. Marianne Groat gave a brief overview of the responses received and invited

participants to provide further input into two topics: Parent engagement and programming for Indigenous students.

To support table discussions, Student Achievement Leader for Indigenous Well-Being, Kirsty Howie, and Superintendent Ann Gilmore shared that suggestions from previous meetings focused on specialized programs for Indigenous students. They requested feedback on the potential benefits, concerns, or input to help guide the next steps in exploring the creation of a program tailored specifically for Indigenous students with smaller participant numbers.

At the May meeting, a summary of IEC feedback from this and previous meetings will be shared as we look towards plans for the 2025-2026 school year.
