4. Indigenous Student Trustee and Leadership Team Update

On behalf of the student leadership team, Kirsty shared updates on recent events. This year, more than 54 self-identified students from 14 schools have registered to take part in the Indigenous Student Leadership Team. A recent team building session was well attended and enjoyed by the group. Grades 7 & 8 students took part in the annual Youth Symposium, engaging in leadership learning and Haudenosaunee Social Dancing. Participation grew significantly this year, with 51 elementary schools and 179 Indigenous students attending over the two-day event – nearly double last year’s numbers.

5. IEC Website Feedback

A feedback summary was presented to the group following their suggestions from the last meeting for improving the external website for Indigenous Education.

- Making it easier to navigate
- Clarifying how to access support
- Explaining self-identification better
- Showcase programs and supports
- Strengthen community connections

a. 2024/2025 Update

b. 2025/2026 Overview

- iv. Supporting Indigenous Education Planning

Initiatives for the 2025-2026 BAP were shared with the group for feedback and suggestions.
