




Fun in the Snow

HOW TO MAKE A SNOW VOLCANO


Materials

- A cup or plastic bottle
- Baking soda
- Vinegar
- Food coloring

In a tall cup or plastic bottle, add 1 tablespoon of dish soap, fill halfway with baking soda and mix in 1/4 cup of warm water. You can add several drops of red food coloring in the cup. Place the cup in the snow and build a snow volcano around the cup. Pack the snow right up to the cup and make sure you can't see the cup. Make sure to leave a hole in the top. Have your child pour the vinegar in the top of the volcano and watch it erupt! Repeat for more fun!



A Fun Dice Game!





What you need to play:

- A die or cube with dots drawn on the sides to represent the numerals
- Markers, crayons, etc.
- White circles cut out of paper towel or some other white material

If they roll a number they've already used, they don't draw anything for that turn.

Ice is Nice!



Watch this video or look at this picture from Wonderopolis!


What do you notice?

What makes ice melt?

Go on an investigation to figure out how to melt ice!

Put water in cups and put them in a very cold place overnight to freeze them (ex., freezer or outside).

Try melting the ice with cold water, warm water, salt, sugar. Make a prediction about what you think will happen.

What made the ice melt the fastest? Slowest?











Sing along with the cast of "Frozen" as they cut, find and use ice in their environment. Ice can be very useful!





What happens in the beginning of the story? What happens in the middle of the story? What happens at the end of the story?






Draw or trace a big heart on a piece of paper.

After Reading

Do you think Harry will want to have a bath from now on? Why or why not?

Playdough Numbers

I cup flour
4 cup salt
I cup water
I tablespoon veg oil
3 teaspoons white
vinegar
Cinnamon scented
oil/extract
Food colouring

Mix the flour and salt. Add the water, vinegar and oil, stir well. Have a grown up put it on the stove on low heat. Keep stirring until it gets dough-like. Remove from the heat and let cool. Knead the dough. Add a few drops of cinnamon scented oil or extract as you knead. Roll dough and form numbers!
