

Cut out a long rectangle from the piece of cardstock. (Have a grown-up help if you need it). Hole punch a hole in the top. Lace a small string through and tie a knot. Decorate with anything you'd like!


Use this chart to make your own secret words!



Create an Ocean World at Home!

Can you create an ocean at home? Here are some ideas of ways to create a small world ocean!

Fill a container with water and add blue food colouring. You can use a Tupperware container, baking dish or even your sink or bathtub! You could add small ocean toys, dolls and rocks, gems, shells, different sized cups etc.

While playing in the water, think about which items sink and which items float.

Think about which cup holds the most water. Does it feel heavier than the smaller cups? How many small cups of water are needed to fill a big one?





Ocean Process Art

Process art is focused on the process of the experience and not the finished product!

Materials:

Paper, blue paint, white paint, green paint, plastic forks, paint brushes, sponges, string, glitter etc.

Mix paint to make new paint colours that you might see in the ocean! Use your painting tools to make lines, scrape, dab and design! You can use your fingers too! When it's dried, make some fish and other ocean creatures to put on top!




Shape Hunt

For this activity, you can let your child find shapes around the home (without preparation) OR you can draw 2-D shapes and hide them around your home (or outside).




Extra Practice Ideas:


