MINUTES OF MEETING

Welcome and Introductions

Amal and Emily welcomed the students and reviewed the Student Trustee Senate meeting process.

Approval of the Agenda

Report from Trustees

Report from Student Trustees

Emily and Amal attended the OSTA-AECO meeting from Nov 2-5, 2017. They participated in professional development at this meeting. Amal described that there are various committees. Emily spoke about the Ontario Student Voice Awards Committee and Amal spoke about the Minister Student Advisory Committee.

Amal highlighted that there is funding available for student initiatives through Speak Up Grants. Speak Up Grant applications are due December 7, 2017.

Education Foundation of Niagara(EFN)

Cindy Paskey Executive Director and Dave Robitaille, Chair of the Board of Directors for EFN thanked the senate for inviting them to speak. The Education Foundation of Niagara (EFN) focuses on helping students and programs within the DSBN. Their goal is to create equal opportunities for all DSBN students. Some of the programs that EFN runs are Glasses for Classes, Prom Project, student bursaries and awards, Swim to Survive, and Canada Learning Bonds. An upcoming opportunity for the senate to participate in is Make Change for Children. Make Change for Children supports the work that EFN does to allow DSBN students to access basic necessities that they might otherwise go without. Dave acknowledged the work that Tristan, Amal and Vani have already done by participating on the EFN board. EFN would like to provide more support for students and would like the student senate to help with raising funds. Students asked about what types of activities they could do at their schools to help raise funds for EFN and how they could get in contact with EFN. Cindy and Dave shared that applications to EFN for student help are submitted by educators.

Lina shared that Westlane held a Mental Wellness Fair where they involved several community partners. Westlane also had a star initiative for random acts of kindness day that involved encouraging one another within the school community.
