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PURPOSE OF THE CONTEST:

To test the competitor's theoretical knowledge, practical skills, and abilities pertaining to standards within the carpentry industry.

EVENT DETAILS:

Date: Tuesday March 10 & Wednesday March 11, 2026

Time: 8:00AM (Arrival & Setup) to 3:00PM (Clean-up & Judging)

Location: Castle Niagara Building & Design Centre 2880 Hwy 20

ENTRY: Please connect with a teacher advisor at your school to complete your registration for this competition to be eligible to participate.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

- Theoretical knowledge of carpentry and general practices.
- Blueprint reading and interpretation.
- Design and layout of building materials
- Construction/Assembly of a project
- Safe operation of hand and power tools.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:

Competitors are required to follow all "Industry Safety Standards" during the competition.

- It is mandatory for all competitors to wear CSA approved **EYEWEAR**.
- It is mandatory for all competitors to wear CSA approved **FOOTWEAR**.
- It is mandatory for all competitors to wear a CSA approved **HARDHAT**.
- Jewelry such as rings, bracelets, and necklaces or any item deemed unsafe by the competition judges must be removed.
- Proper shop attire must be worn (NO LOOSE CLOTHING)

EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS, TOOLS, AND SUPPLIES:

Equipment Supplied by the DSBN Tech Department and Castle Building Centre:

- All lumber required to complete the project (delivered to Skills Challenge)
- All consumables (hardware/wood screws) to complete the project.

- Carpenter's Belt
- Carpenter's Hammer(s)
- Hand Saw (for Bird's mouth)
- Imperial Measuring Tape(s)
- Pencils
- Framing Square
- Speed Square(s)
- Level(s)(straight edge)

- *****BROOM, DUST PANS & GARBAGE CONTAINER*****

CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS:

- Competitors are to be dressed in a clean appropriate manner.
- Competitors are to wear DSBN technology shirts.
- Competitors are not permitted to wear clothing with any logo other than the DSBN.
 - Safety Glasses, CSA Footwear and Hard Required at "ALL TIMES".
- Any added PPE as per safety policies.

PROJECT AND COMPETITION EXPECTATIONS:

- To be disclosed on **Thursday, February 12, 2026**
- **Students are required to bring their own copy of the plans as well as their own cultist(s)**

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- Judging will be conducted by specialists in Carpentry with the following rubric:

- The trade skill component of this challenge is worth approximately **90%** of the overall mark. The judges will also evaluate the competitor's working knowledge of construction safety, level of independence, and clean-up. Competitors will receive the blueprints and the evaluation three (3) weeks prior to the day of the challenge. At the provincial level, students will be expected to be prepared with a resume and must complete a job interview component.

ENTRY:

- Students must be registered online prior to the **Competition Dates: March 10 & 11** with all of the required information completed to be eligible to participate.

TRANSPORTATION:

- Teachers and students are responsible for their own transportation to and from their respective schools the day of the Carpentry Challenge.

TEACHER'S ROLE:

- Instructors are expected to acquaint their student participants with all of the enclosed guidelines. Teachers/Guests may accompany their students or visit any time during the competition, "But may not assist their own competitors during the challenge."

****Please Note: **** Judges will be instructed to deduct marks from participants that are deemed to be receiving instructions from TEACHERS/Mentors during the build.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND GUIDELINES:

- The use of pneumatic tools is "PROHIBITED"
- Teachers and competitors are responsible for the removal of the project at the end of the Carpentry Challenge.
