

# DSBN REGIONAL ARCHITECTURAL CAD SKILLS CHALLENGE 2024 SECONDARY LEVEL SCOPE

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**PURPOSE OF THE CONTEST:** To challenge competitor's knowledge of architectural design

**EVENT DETAILS:** Date: Wednesday, February 28, 2024

**Time Allotted:** 6 hours

Location: Niagara College - Welland Campus - Room L102

**ENTRY:** Students must register online at <u>2024 Skills Challenge Registration Form</u> with all the required information completed to be eligible to participate.

## SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

In order to prepare students for the upcoming competitions, the challenge will be similar to the Provincial "Skills" competition. Competitors will be given an Architectural Design Project that consists of an existing foundation and site. Students will be required to complete a set of drawings that will include Floor Plan, Foundation Plan, a Front Elevation, a Rear Elevation, a Roof Plan, and one Building Section

## **SAFETY REQUIREMENTS and SUPERVISION**

Teachers or another designate must supervise the student to ensure that safety is adhered to and to maintain the integrity of the competition. If a supply teacher is required, It is preferable to have the supply teacher supervise your student for the Challenge and you can remain with your class, this might not be possible for challenges where safety is a concern.

Other safety considerations: Competitors are required to follow all industry safety standards during the competition

## **Tools and Equipment supplied by the Individual Contest Site:**

- Hardware: Niagara College computer lab, Room L102
- Software: AutoCAD, Autodesk Revit

## **Tools and Equipment supplied by the Competitor Site:**

- Calculator
- Loose paper, pencils/pens to sketch.

## **Materials Supplied Centrally:**

- Required Building Code sections will be available online for student reference.

## **CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS:**

Casual business attire must be worn with DSBN Technology T-shirts

## **JUDGING INSTRUCTION:**

 Competitors will be identified by number only and submissions will be judged by industry professionals.

## **JUDGING CRITERIA:**

Judging criteria will be emailed to all registered student's teachers

#### **TEACHER'S ROLE:**

Instructors are expected to acquaint their student participants with all of the enclosed guidelines and may not assist student competitors during the competition.
