ART ATTACK Integrated Arts 1.0 CREDIT (Grade 7 & 8 students)

Garrison Road Public - July 5th to July 28th

This course integrates four of the arts (drama, media arts, music, and visual arts), giving students the opportunity to produce and present integrated art works created individually or collaboratively. Students will demonstrate innovation as they learn and apply concepts, styles, and conventions unique to the various arts and acquire skills that are transferable beyond the classroom. Students will use the creative process and responsible practices to explore solutions to integrated arts challenges.

FUN & FIT/ Personal & Fitness Activities- Physical Education & Health 1.0 CREDIT

Garrison Road Public Fun & Fit– July 5th to July 28th or Port Colborne High School Personal & Fitness Activities – July 5th to July 28th (Grade 7 & 8 Port Colborne and Greater Fort Erie students only)

This course emphasizes regular participation in a variety of enjoyable physical activities that promote lifelong healthy active living. Student learning will include the application of movement principles to refine skills; participation in a variety of activities that enhance personal competence, fitness, and health; examination of issues related to healthy sexuality, healthy eating, substance use and abuse; and the use of informed decision-making, conflict resolution, and social skills in making personal choices. This is an introductory course that promotes healthy living through enhanced personal competence, fitness-based activities and health.

ROBOT RUMBLE Computer Technology at Port Colborne High School 1.0 CREDIT (Grade 7 & 8 students) Port Colborne High School – July 5th to July 28th

Let's get ready to RUUUMBLE! In the Robot Rumble course you will learn about computers, programming, electronics and control systems all while building your own sumo robot. Each student will have the opportunity to build a small battle ready robot using an Arduino controller. At the end of the course your robot will battle for the ultimate prize (or at least bragging rights). Join us for this action packed course

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation may be provided at no charge for students who attend summer school courses and reside in areas not serviced by public transit as approved by the District School Board of Niagara. Summer school buses cover large rural geographical areas and parents/guardians are responsible to arrange getting their children to and from centralized bus stops located within their community. Students must follow the bus rules on routes to and from Summer School otherwise transportation privileges may be revoked.

Students will be permitted to board the buses at the designated stops for their chosen summer school site as listed on the bus transportation schedule .

Parents/guardians are responsible to arrange transportation for students who are not eligible for service
