About the District School Board of Niagara

DSBN is a publicly funded school district that offers JK—Grade 12 Ontario curriculum leading to the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Graduates are prepared for entry to post-secondary institutions worldwide. DSBN schools are found in the heart of the famous Niagara Falls area in the province of Ontario. Niagara's population is 500,000 and the region is located one hour's drive from



Toronto. Niagara is a safe community offering a wide variety of cultural, educational, leisure, shopping, and tourism activities. Niagara has good health care facilities, public transportation, various churches, and multicultural services. The Region is situated in the southernmost area of Canada with a milder climate in the Winter and between two of the five Great Lakes. It is also close to the New York, U.S.A. border.

English as a Second Language Services (ESL)

Comprehensive ESL services are available at Westlane Secondary School and St. Catharines Collegiate and at all of the 100 elementary schools. International students are assessed for level of English and math at the time of arrival and placed into appropriate ESL and regular academic classes to meet their needs for success. International students will get a high level of English immersion experience every day. Once a high level of ESL is reached, student may attend any of the 21 high schools. Upon arrival, students will be greeted at the friendly Welcome Centre and given an orientation to starting school and to living in the Niagara Region. Secondary School

Secondary school (high school or senior middle school) includes Grades 9-12. The school year is September to June and is divided into two semesters each offering four courses for a total of eight courses per year. Students may start in September or February. Schools range in size from 600 to 1,000 students. Schools offer both academic and vocational pathways for either university or college preparation. Curriculum includes: English, math, science, technology, business, history, geography, arts, French, health and physical education. Class size averages 25 students. Schools have academic counselors for advice on course selection and applying to universities worldwide. Schools offer many sports for both boys and girls such as baseball, basketball, skiing, hockey, football, rowing, swimming, track & field, volleyball and more. They also offer arts programs such as music, art, drama, and dance. Classrooms have a high proportion of native English speakers so students will be immersed in an English-speaking environment.

Elementary School

Elementary school (primary to junior middle school) includes Grades Kindergarten-Grade 8 for ages 4-13. The school year is September to June and is not semestered, but students may start any time. Students have one main teacher for most of their subjects plus a few teachers for specialty subjects. Students study English, math, science, technology, social studies, the arts, French, health, and physical education.

Class size averages 22 students.
There is an emphasis placed on
literacy and numeracy
development as well as character
education. Schools offer activities



such as ice-skating, music, sports, fitness, drama and more. Schools have special education services for students with learning difficulties and ESL services for language improvement. Classrooms have a high proportion of native English speakers so students will be immersed in an English-speaking environment.

Post-secondary Pathways



Niagara is home to Brock University, one of Canada's best for quality education. Also, Niagara is home to Niagara College of Applied Arts & Technology, named "Canada's Most Enterprising." About 95% of international students who graduate grade 12 from the DSBN gain acceptance to reputable universities including Western, Waterloo, Toronto, McMaster and Brock in the province of Ontario and in other universities in the U.S. A. and worldwide.
