Secondary School

Secondary school in Ontario includes Grades 9-12 and student ages are typically 14 –17 years. The program has two semesters per year which run September-January and February-June. Students may start in either September or February. The program leads to high-school graduation with the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

Our secondary schools provide both academic courses (university preparation) and applied courses (vocational college preparation). Of all our secondary schools, the following four (4) additionally provide a high level of ESL support for international students.:

All other secondary schools offer ESL support services on a periodic basis suitable for students whose English language proficiency is already high.

Elementary School



Elementary school in Ontario includes Grades K-8 and student ages are typically 5-13 years. The program runs September–June and is not semestered; therefore, students may start at any time during the school year.

Of all our elementary schools, nine (9) of them offer a high level of daily ESL support for international students. For a list of these ESL-site schools, visit the dsbn.org website and search Schools.

All other elementary schools offer a limited amount of ESL support on a periodic basis and are suitable for students whose English language proficiency is already high.

School Placement

Students will attend the designated school based on their:

- Level of need for ESL support; and

Homestay & Custodianship
