PRO Grants

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Parents Reaching Out Grants (PRO Grants) are grants offered by the Ministry of Education

PRO Grant program was established in 2006 and has since given out over 22,000 School Council grants

Investment totalling over \$34.5 million to increase parent engagement

PURPOSE OF PRO GRANTS

❖ Parents are a key part of success in education and student achievement

- Encourages parent engagement at local and regional levels
- Supports identifying barriers to parent engagement and producing local solutions to involve more parents in student achievement and well being

TYPES OF PRO GRANTS

Two types of PRO Grants

School Council

Parent organizations, PIC's, non profit community organizations, etc.

Funding is different for these two types of grants

SCHOOL COUNCIL GRANTS

- School councils of publicly funded schools
- Initiatives focused on engaging parents who may experience challenges in becoming involved in the school
- Examples of barriers may include language, recent immigration, poverty, new to Ontario's school system, and so forth
- School Councils may apply for up to \$1,000
- May develop application individually, or with another school and/or community group (grant money would be combined)

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Council decides in conjunction with the principal if it wishes to apply for the grant and what the grant will be for

2018-2019 SPECIAL CONSIDERATION

- 1. support and engage parents who have **not been previously active** in the school community, parents from racially or ethnically diverse communities, or hard-to-reach parents; and/or
- 2.support the engagement of parents from Indigenous communities; and/or
- 3.promote increased access to and awareness of **math strategies** and resources for parents to support their children's learning at home and at school; and/or
- 4.promote the **value of postsecondary education** (apprenticeship, college, or university) by providing parents with information on postsecondary education pathways, possibilities, and supports for their children.

HOW TO USE A PRO GRANT

PRO Grants can purchase resources for parents and the community

- PRO Grants can be used to host workshops for parents
- *PRO Grants can be used towards a special speaker for an event

*Materials, food, staff and so forth can be funded in limited part through the PRO Grant

EXAMPLES OF PRO GRANTS

- *Education themed evenings (i.e. math, science, literacy nights)
- Purchase resources for parents (lending library, math manipulatives, etc.)
- Social media training for parents
- Mental health supports and/or workshops for parents
- Healthy Living seminars
- Financial Literacy Event, resources
- Physical well being information (i.e. concussion information)
- Supporting your child through French Immersion
- *Many more, including combination of ideas

APPLICATION

- *Five step process for application once you have created an account
 - 1. School Information- simple questions, i.e. name of school, principal, address
 - 2. Partner Information- simple yes/no question
 - 3. Project Information- more difficult short answer questions about the project:
 - Explain the need for the project at your school
 - Consider all the ways the project reduces barriers, highlight them
 - State parent involvement in the project (more involvement greater chance of funding)
 - You do not need to know who will be presenting, just what the topic is
 - Question "Who will do it" is about organizers not presenter
 - Need to develop method to evaluate success of the project

4. Budget

- Drop down selections, indicates automatically if you have gone over budget
- Ask for full \$1,000
- 5. Submit Application

IMPORTANT DATES

- *Application for PRO Grant is due on June 5th at 11:59pm
- *Approval will be announced in September 2018

The project must take place before June 30th 2019
